Notice: All anglers entering a tournament are subjected to the rules and by entering the tournament you are agreeing that you have read the rules, accept the rules and will abide by the rules.

PARTIAL RULES (Complete rules are posted online at www.outdoorkidsllc.com)

By your participation in this Tournament, you agree to comply with the following rules, and the boat captain agrees to submit to and pass a POLYGRAPH TEST or similar truth test in order to qualify for the team receipt of any prize. Tests will be given at Kids Outdoor LLC discretion.

- 1. Students may enter alone or with a partner of your choice. No more than three (3) persons will be allowed in a participating boat during tournament hours. May fish as a 1 or 2 member team and 1 boat captain.
- 2. Students must be signed up for the tournament by midnight on the Monday before the tournament.
- 3. Students may participate in the tournament from the time they are going into their freshman year (having completed jr. high or middle school) up until the time they have entered college. At least one team member must be of the proceeding age. The other team member may be as young as 12. Students must be a resident of the state they are fishing in.
- 4. Students must provide proof of passing grades when signing up or at Anglers Meeting on Friday night before the event.
- 5. Student anglers may get their voucher at Angler Meeting at 5:00 pm on the Friday night before event or Saturday morning from 6 am to 7:30 am.
- 6. SEMINAR: One team member must be present at Seminar Friday evening and remain until the Seminar is dismissed unless approved by Tournament Director for emergency reasons.
- 7. WEATHER: In the case of extreme weather/water conditions or National emergencies, Kids Outdoor LLC shall have the right to postpone or cancel any tournaments.
- 8. FISHING HOURS: Fishing hours are 8:00 AM to 2:00 PM. Anglers must be in the weigh in line by 3:00 PM. There will be a mandatory live-well, cooler check starting at 5:00 AM to 6:30 AM at the weigh-in location.
- 9. STATE LAW: Teams must comply with all State and boating regulations throughout the entire year, including the use of P.F.D.'s and kill switches. Fishing, boating regulations, and licenses are the responsibility of team members. State fishing laws and boating regulations supersede tournament rules. Violation of State or Lake laws is grounds for disqualification.
- 10. MINORS: Any minor (under 18) who participates, must make arrangements to have a parent or guardian present at the weigh-in to sign a release form or have the release on the entry form signed prior to the tournament, to allow a polygraph examination if required by the tournament director.
- 11. BIG FISH: Only one (1) Big Fish entry per team. Only one (1) big fish will be weighed in. Teams will have that fish marked and designated as their big fish at weigh-in.
- 12. PRIZES: Prizes will be given after the tournament. Teams must be present to receive prize.
- 13. OFF LIMITS: Tournament waters are off limits the Monday thru Thursday the week of the tournament. Team may pre-fish the weekends prior to the tournament and Friday, the week of the tournament. Teams must quit fishing at 4:00 pm that Friday.
- 14. FISHABLE WATERS: Fishing within 50 feet of a Marina gas pump or within 50 feet of a competitor's boat, which is first anchored, is prohibited (Trolling motors must be in up position and anchor rope visible or any shallow water anchoring device must be deployed to be considered anchored). A safe and courteous distance (50 feet) should be maintained when trolling motors are in use. Fishable waters are areas that tournament officials can access the fishing team via a John boat with a gasoline propelled tiller handle with lower unit. Boats may fish anywhere except areas designated as "off limits" or "no fishing" by Local, State or Federal officials or as posted on the Tournament Information page or announced at the Seminar. Any violation of off-limits water will result in disqualification. Participants are not allowed to exit the boat to gain access to fishable waters. Teams may enter fishable waters at any public access ramp. Trailering is allowed.
- 15. ALCOHOL: Alcohol beverages are not allowed during the tournaments. Use of alcohol or non-prescribed drugs during tournament hours is prohibited and will result in disqualification.
- 16. COMPENSATION: No one can be hired, compensated, or offered compensation in any way to fish with you, mark fishing spots for you, or help you gain a competitive advantage in anyway 30 days prior to any tournament.

FISHING

- 17. BOATS: You must fish from a boat. Rubber Rafts, Canoes and Go-Devils are not allowed. One boat per team must stay within 25 feet of each other while fishing.
- 18. POLES: Limit of eight (8) poles per team during tournament applies except where a state limit is set at a lesser number. Teams may use rod and reel combos, hand-held pole and reel combos or hand-held poles.
- 19. BAITS: A maximum of two baits per pole may be used during tournament hours if in accordance with Local and State laws. Live and artificial bait may be used excluding Ultimate Challenge

tournaments.

- 20. MOTORS: All tournament boats are required to have a minimum 6 HP or greater motor.
- 21. OTHER EQUIPMENT: Binoculars and other magnifying devices are not allowed during tournament hours. Under water cameras during competition is not allowed. The use of mobile communication devices such as cellular phones, marine radios, walkie-talkies, CB'S, etc. to communicate fishing information during tournament hours is prohibited.
- 22. SPOTTING: During tournament hours no one may spot fish for you or mark fishing spots for you.
 23. LANDING FISH: Crappie must be hooked and landed with a rod or pole by team member(s).
 Crappie must be hooked through the lip or in the mouth. Landing nets may be used. Boater may help net and unhook fish only.
- 24. HOLE- SITTING: No hole sitting by a competitor or non-competitor boat during the tournament will be allowed.
- 25. LIFE JACKETS: Life jackets or personal flotation devices must be worn while on plane. All State and Local rules and regulations supersede tournament rules.

WEIGH IN

- 26. VOUCHER: A weigh-in voucher will be issued to each registered team at the Registration/ Seminar sign-up. That voucher must be presented back to the tournament official at the weigh-in.
- 27. SCALES: Scales will be set up and open two hours before the end of the official fishing hours for all tournaments.
- 28. FISH: All fish must be brought to the official weigh-in line in a cooler. Coolers must be a minimum of 30 quarts. Failure to bring your fish to the weigh-in line in a cooler will result in disqualification. Fish bags or buckets are prohibited. Teams may weigh in Five (5), live crappie on tournament day. Teams five (5) crappie must be alive when entering the official weigh-in line. Teams presenting more than five crappie will be disqualified. Once you have entered the weigh-in line, your fish will be counted and be verified dead or alive by the tournament official. Dead fish will be removed and you may then continue to the scales for your official weigh-in. Once your fish have been verified alive, and entered on the weigh-in voucher, you will then be allowed to weigh those fish, even if one or more die before reaching the scales. The tournament official has sole responsibility for the declaration of dead or alive crappie. No mutilated fish may be weighed. Mutilation is defined as any damage that impairs the fish's fighting ability. All decisions regarding mutilation will be made by Kids Outdoor LLC tournament officials. Kids Outdoor LLC has the right to keep weighed in fish for further evaluation at our own discretion without explanation or cause.
- 29. WEIGH IN SITE: Crappie must be weighed at the official Kids Outdoor LLC tournament Weigh-In site. You must check in at the official check in site by the announced time on the Tournament Information Page or as announced at the seminar. Director will make the announcement when the check in line is closed and the last team in line will have their voucher marked.
- 30. TOURNAMENT HOURS: All crappie brought to the scales for weigh-in must have been caught during the tournament hours from tournament waters by the team bringing them to the scales. Teams will be allowed to be on the tournament waters, on tournament day, two hours prior to the official starting time of the tournament at 6:00 AM. Teams may begin fishing at 8:00 am and your baits must be out of the tournament waters at 2:00:00 pm. If your baits are in the tournament waters at 2:00:01 pm, then you will be disqualified.
- 31. LENGTH: All crappie brought to the scales for weigh-in must meet State length requirements for the State in which they are being weighed and may not have any weight enhancements. Any team bringing in illegal crappie to the weigh-in line will be disqualified.
- 32. TIES: In the case of a tie for first place, big fish of each team will determine the winner. Second place and on down, all ties split the combined purse of that prize level.

RELEASE
